PROCEDURE: RS-22	SUBJECT: SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATES
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DESCRIPTION:

This procedure provides information and instructions to guide employees and agents of the department with issuing Florida’s specialty license plates.

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DEFINITION:

Specialty License Plates are available to the public without having to meet specific qualifications, (exceptions: Fraternal Order of Police and US Paratrooper) and which require payment of an additional annual use fee. These license plates are often referred to as trust-fund license plates.

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED AND SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- A. Any county Tax Collector or license plate agency may process applications for specialty license plates.
- B. Only current or former members of the United States military who, as part of their military duty, have been trained to jump from flying aircraft may request, and be issued, the US Paratrooper license plate after submitting proof that they have been decorated as a parachutist, or have completed the U.S. Army Jump School. Refer to [Procedure RS-15](#).
- C. These license plates may be issued to any vehicle (including leased). However, this excludes tractors and those vehicles that require "Restricted", "Apportioned", "Indefinite", motorcycle size (except motorcycle specialty) license plates and dual (two) truck license plates. Refer to [Procedure RS-53](#) for registering a leased vehicle in the name of the lessee/registrant.
- D. Proof of Insurance: Proof of Florida insurance is required. Refer to [Procedure RS-36](#) for additional insurance requirements.
- E. Fees: Refer to form [HSMV 83140](#) for applicable fees in addition to the specialty plate annual use fees. When individuals purchase a specialty plate for a period of more than 13 months, all fees including annual use, processing, EMS, Law Enforcement Radio Systems Trust Fund, Juvenile Justice, Transportation Disadvantage and State Transportation Surcharge fees are doubled.

SPECIALTY PLATE VOUCHERS:

Anyone at any time may purchase a "Specialty Plate Voucher" for any specialty license plate, including personalized and amateur radio license plates. The "Specialty Plate Voucher" is issued for a specific customer (the recipient) for a specific type of specialty plate. An individual may not purchase a voucher for one type of specialty plate and apply it toward the payment of another specialty plate. A processing fee, service fee, branch fee and specialty plate fee will be charged when the voucher is purchased. All other applicable fees will be charged when the specialty plate is issued. The voucher will print on plain paper and has no expiration date. It is valid for use one-time, only during any transaction that charges the specialty fee. A voucher cannot be transferred, replaced, refunded or exchanged.

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RENEWALS AND TRANSFERS:

Any county Tax Collector or license plate agency may process renewals and transfers.

REPLACEMENT LICENSE PLATES:

Any county Tax Collector or license plate agency may process applications for replacement license plates.

The following is required:

- A. Form [HSMV 83146](#), accurately completed.
- B. A copy of the vehicle registration certificate.
Refer to [Procedure RS-06](#) for additional information and fees.
- C. When an **customer** attests on form [HSMV 83146](#) that a license plate or decal has been stolen and reported it as stolen to a law enforcement agency, the **customer** is not charged a replacement fee.

DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS FOR ANNUAL USE FEES:

The fees and any interest earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of U.S. military and veteran related specialty license plates.

- A. As used in this subsection, the term "administrative expenses" means those expenditures which are considered as direct operating costs of the organization. Such costs include, but are not limited to, the following:
 1. Administrative salaries of employees and officers of the organization who do not or cannot prove, via detailed daily time sheets, that they actively participate in program activities.
 2. Bookkeeping and support services of the organization.
 3. Office supplies and equipment not directly utilized for the specified program.
 4. Travel time, per diem, mileage reimbursement and lodging expenses not directly associated with a specified program purpose.
 5. Paper, printing, envelopes and postage not directly associated with a specified program purpose.
 6. Miscellaneous expenses such as food, beverage, entertainment and conventions.

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GENERAL INFORMATION:

- A. All specialty license plates may be issued as personalized license plates. Refer to [Procedure RS-27](#) for additional information.
- B. The department is authorized to discontinue issuing any specialty license plate if the number of valid specialty license plate registrations falls below 1,000 for at least 12 consecutive months.
A warning letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization of each plate whose total number of valid specialty license plate registrations is below 1,000.
[Section 320.08056\(8\), Florida Statutes](#), exempts Collegiate license plates from the minimum sales requirement.
- C. The organization that requested the specialty license plate may not request a redesign of the specialty license plate, unless the inventory of license plates has been depleted, or the organization pays for the remaining inventory at cost.
- D. The remaining inventory will be sent to PRIDE to be destroyed, it is not available to the organization.
- E. Organizational recipients are required to submit an annual audit of expenditures of the annual use fees to determine if they are being made in accordance with the law.
See [Procedure RS-39](#) for detailed information regarding audit and attestation requirements.
- F. Organizational recipients are required to notify the department if the organization no longer exists.

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DISTRIBUTION AND PURPOSE OF THE ANNUAL USE FEES:

Unless otherwise directed by statute, the department retains all annual use fees from the sale of specialty plates until all startup costs for developing and issuing the plates have been recovered. After that, the fees are distributed as follows:

A. AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION:

The license plate annual use fees are distributed quarterly to the Florida Future Farmers of America Foundation, Inc. to fund activities and services of the Future Farmers of America.

1. Up to ten percent of the annual use fee revenue may be used for administrative, handling and disbursement expenses.
2. Up to five percent may be used for advertising and marketing costs.
3. All remaining annual use fee revenue shall be used by the Florida Future Farmers of America Foundation, Inc. to fund its activities, programs and projects, including, but not limited to, student and teacher leadership programs, the Foundation for Leadership Training Center, teacher recruitment, retention and other special projects.

B. AMERICAN LEGION:

Annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the American Legion Department of Florida, which may use up to ten percent of such fees for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The balance of the fees shall be used by the American Legion Department of Florida to support Florida American Legion Boys State, the American Legion Auxiliary Girls State, the American Legion Department of Florida Veteran Affairs and Rehabilitation program, the Gilchrist Endowment Fund, and other appropriate activities.

C. ANIMAL FRIEND:

Annual use fees shall be distributed as follows:

1. The Florida Animal Friend, Inc., for spay and neuter programs in the state.
2. No more than ten percent of the fees may be used for administrative costs directly associated with marketing and promotion of the license plate and distribution of funds.
3. The annual use fees shall not be used for litigation.

D. AQUACULTURE:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution, Inc. for use as follows:

1. Ten percent of the funds shall be distributed to the Guy Harvey Research Institute of the Nova Southeastern University Oceanographic Center to conduct outreach and education regarding aquaculture in the state.
2. Up to 15 percent of the funds may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution's Aquaculture programs and administrative costs associated with the Aquaculture license plate.

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3. Up to ten percent of the funds may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.
4. The remaining funds shall be used to conduct scientific research on environmentally responsible and sustainable methods of farming freshwater and saltwater organisms such as fish, shellfish and crustaceans for food; biomedical species for pharmaceutical and nutraceutical compounds and marine ornamentals for the aquarium trade. These funds shall also be used to expand the institution's educational programs that include secondary school field experiences, college degree programs and intensive courses to further the objective of increasing aquaculture's contribution to the state's economy.

E. A STATE OF VISION:

The license plate annual use fees are distributed quarterly to the Florida Association of Agencies Serving the Blind, Inc. to fund direct-support services to blind and visually impaired people.

The Florida Association of Agencies Serving the Blind, Inc. will retain all revenue from the annual fees until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter:

1. Up to five percent of the annual use fee revenue shall be used for administrative costs.
2. Twenty percent shall be used for promotion and marketing of the specialty plate.
3. Remaining annual use fee revenue shall be used by the Florida Association of Agencies Serving the Blind, Inc. to fund its activities, programs and projects within the state through its local not for profit organizations direct support services to blind and visually impaired people.

F. BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS:

Annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Big Brothers Big Sisters Association of Florida, Inc., which may use up to ten percent of such fees for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The balance of the fees shall be used by Big Brothers Big Sisters Association of Florida, Inc., to promote mentoring.

G. BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA:

The proceeds from the annual use fee must be forwarded to the Central Florida Council with statistics on sales of the license plates, which are tabulated by county. The Central Florida Council must distribute to each of the nine councils the money received from sales in the counties within the respective council. It may be used for administrative expenses, office and professional services, year-round camping facilities, the recruitment of adult leaders and their continuing training, the maintenance of current facilities and the continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.

H. BREAST CANCER RESEARCH (End Breast Cancer):

The Breast Cancer Research license plate annual use fee shall be distributed to the Florida Breast Cancer Coalition Research Foundation. The annual use fees are to be annually allocated as follows:

1. All fees collected shall be forwarded quarterly to the Florida Breast Cancer Coalition Research Foundation.

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2. The foundation shall provide for a peer review grant solicitation and award process to distribute the fees as follows:
 - a. Basic, clinical and translational breast cancer research
 - b. Epidemiological studies of breast cancer
 - c. Research on possible links between breast cancer and the environment
 - d. Psychoimmunological research
 - e. Innovative awards and idea grants

I. CHALLENGER/COLUMBIA:

The Challenger/Columbia license plate annual use fee must be distributed to the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc. to support the operations of the Center for Space Education and the Space Mirror Memorial located at the Kennedy Space Center. Funds received by the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc., may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the center and the memorial. These funds must be used for the maintenance and support of the operations of the Center for Space Education and the Space Mirror Memorial operated by the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc. These operations must include programs and infrastructure that inform, inspire and educate the public on the benefits of human space flight. Up to 20 percent of funds received by the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc. may be expended for administrative costs.

J. CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION (STOP CHILD ABUSE):

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Children's Home Society of Florida and the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers as follows: The first \$90,000 is to be divided between the two organizations for start-up costs. Thereafter, 50 percent of the proceeds shall be distributed to the Children's Home Society of Florida, which must distribute the funds proportionately to each of its divisions, to be used for child abuse prevention programs. The other 50 percent are to be distributed to the board of directors of the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, Inc. for the first five years, a maximum of 20 percent of the annual use fees collected may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the marketing and promotion of the license plate.

Ten percent of the fees shall be allocated to the Children's Home Society of Florida and ten percent shall be allocated to the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, Inc. Five years after the date the first license plate is issued, revenues from license plate sales may not be used for marketing or promoting the license plate.

K. CHOOSE LIFE:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to Choose Life, Inc. along with a report specifying the ratio that the fees collected by each county bear to total fees for the plates within Florida. Choose Life, Inc. shall distribute each county's share of the funds to non-governmental, not-for-profit agencies within each Florida county, which assist pregnant women who are making an adoption plan for their children.

Agencies receiving funds must use them to provide for material needs of pregnant women who are making an adoption plan for their children, including, but not limited to clothing, housing, medical care, food, utilities and transportation. Funds may also be expended on birth mothers for 60 days after delivery and for adoption-related expenses.

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A maximum of 15 percent of the total funds received annually may be used by Choose Life, Inc. to administer and promote its license plate program.

If no qualified agency applies to receive funds in a county in any year, that county's Choose Life funds shall be distributed pro rata to any qualified agencies that apply and maintain a place of business within a 100-mile radius of that county's county seat. If no qualified agencies apply, Choose Life, Inc. shall hold the funds until a qualified agency under this section applies for the funds.

Each year, each agency must submit an annual attestation to Choose Life, Inc. as well as any unused funds exceeding ten percent. Choose Life, Inc. will distribute these funds to other qualified agencies in Florida. The department and each county shall transfer all Choose Life license plate funds to Choose Life, Inc. by October 1, 2011.

L. COLLEGIATE:

The collegiate annual use fee must be distributed to the state or independent university foundation designated by the purchaser. These funds may be used only for academic enhancement, including scholarships and private fundraising activities.

M. CONSERVE WILDLIFE:

The annual use fee is used as follows:

1. Ten percent may be used for marketing the Conserve Wildlife license plate and administrative costs directly related to the management and distribution of the proceeds.
2. The remaining proceeds shall be used for programs and activities of the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission that contribute to the health and wellbeing of Florida black bears and other wildlife diversity.

N. DISCOVER FLORIDA'S OCEANS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Hubbs Florida Ocean Fund, Inc. which shall distribute the funds as follows:

1. Twenty-five percent shall be distributed to the Wildlife Foundation of Florida Inc. to be used for ocean, estuarine or coastal scientific research, conservation and education projects.
2. Up to ten percent may be used for administrative costs directly associated with research, conservation and education programs of the Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute and with the license plate.
3. Up to 15 percent may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.

The remaining funds shall be used to collect, analyze, archive and publish scientific data regarding the state's ocean, estuary and coastal habitats and the species that inhabit, use or migrate in state waters or along the state's coastal areas; to provide response, care assistance and research as part of the Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute's role in responding to and archiving data on stranded marine species; to construct and maintain a marine and coastal research center in association with the Archie Carr National Wildlife Refuge, on lands donated to the Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute by the Richard King Mellon Foundation; to train teachers and students to enhance scientific literacy, research competency and technology development; to conduct ocean-space aquatic research and scientific research focused on ocean observations from space; to conduct research on economic benefits of the state's ocean, estuary and coastal resources and public use of those resources; to create research and education programs that contribute to the economy; and to implement programs that seek objective, common-sense, scientific solutions to the complex marine and coastal ecological problems facing the state.

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O. ENDLESS SUMMER:

The annual fees shall be distributed to Surfing's Evolution and Preservation Corporation to fund its activities, programs and projects aimed at preserving the sport of surfing. Surfing's Evolution and Preservation Corporation may retain all revenue from the annual use fees until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, up to ten percent of the annual use fee revenue may be used for promotion and marketing of the specialty license plate and administrative costs directly associated with the corporation's programs and the specialty license plate. Surfing's Evolution and Preservation Corporation shall use the remaining funds as follows:

1. To fund the proposed Surfing's Evolution and Preservation Experience project.
2. To provide funds for the provisions of lifeguards or the building of artificial reefs.
3. To provide funds to organizations that house the history and artifacts of surfing or promote the sport through exhibits, lectures and events.
4. To support programs and events of other organizations that advocate beaches and oceans and promote education on beach safety, coastal pollution and beach ecology.

P. EVERGLADES RIVER OF GRASS:

The annual fees shall be distributed to the Everglades Trust Fund, administered by the South Florida Water Management District, and used for the conservation, and protection, of the natural resources and abatement of water pollution in the Everglades. Fifty percent of the annual fee must be used for Everglades research.

Q. FALLEN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc., which may use a maximum of ten percent of the proceeds to promote and market the plate. The remainder of the proceeds shall be used by the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc. to invest and reinvest; the interest earnings shall be used for the operation of the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc.

R. FAMILY FIRST:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to Family First to fund programs, projects, seminars, events and family resources that promote principles for building marriages, guiding parents and raising children. Family First shall retain all revenue from the sale of the license plate until its startup costs for developing and establishing the license plates have been recovered. Family First shall use the remaining funds as follows:

1. Up to five percent of the funds received by Family First may be expended for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of Family First.
2. Up to 20 percent of the funds received by Family First may be expended for promoting and marketing the license plate.
3. Family First may expend all remaining funds for programs.

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S. FAMILY VALUES:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to Sheridan House, Inc., which shall retain all funds until all startup costs for developing and establishing the license plate has been recovered. Thereafter, the funds shall be used as follows: 1. Up to five percent shall be expended for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of Sheridan House, Inc., and up to 20 percent shall be expended for promotion and marketing of the license plate.

2. All remaining funds shall be expended by Sheridan House, Inc. to fund residential care programs, family counseling, social services for single parents and their children, resources materials and facility construction.

T. FISH FLORIDA:

All proceeds of the annual use fee shall be distributed to the Florida Foundation for Responsible Angling, Inc. to fund aquatic education, marine resource stewardship and ethical angling practices in this state. A maximum of 15 percent of the funds received may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the foundation's grant distribution program and license plate funding. A maximum of ten percent may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate. The foundation shall provide for a peer review grant solicitation and award process to distribute the remainder of the funds to benefit aquatic education, marine resource stewardship and ethical angling practices in this state.

U. FLORIDA AGRICULTURE (Agriculture):

The proceeds from the annual use fee must be forwarded to the direct-support organization created in Section 570.912, Florida Statutes. The funds must be used for the sole purpose of funding and promoting Florida agriculture in the classroom program established within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services pursuant to [Section 570.912, Florida Statutes](#). Up to twenty five percent of the funds distributed may be used for promotion, marketing and administrative costs directly associated with the license plate and Florida agriculture in classroom programs.

V. FLORIDA ARTS (State of the Arts):

All annual use fees collected must be forwarded quarterly to the single arts council (officially designated by the county) in direct proportion to the amounts of fees collected in each county. If there is no county arts council, fees collected must be forwarded to such other agency in the county (as the highest-ranking county administrative official designates) to be applied by the arts council or agency to support arts organizations, programs and activities within the county.

W. FLORIDA BIODIVERSITY FOUNDATION (Save Wild Florida):

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Biodiversity Foundation, Inc., which shall retain 50 percent of the proceeds until the startup costs to develop and establish the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds shall be used as follows:

1. A maximum of ten percent of the proceeds may be used to fund the administrative, promotion and marketing costs of the license plate program and the foundation.
2. The remaining fees shall be used by the foundation to fund research, education and scientific study of the diversity of animals and plants, and to aid in the preservation, study, conservation and recovery of imperiled organisms.

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X. FLORIDA FIREFIGHTER (Salutes Firefighters):

The Florida Firefighter license plate annual use fee shall be distributed to the Florida Firefighters Charities, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. Florida Firefighters Charities shall distribute the monies according to its Articles of Incorporation.

Y. FLORIDA FOOD BANKS (Imagine):

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Association of Food Banks, Inc., which may use up to 25 percent to market the association's concept and the license plate. The balance shall be used by the association to fund programs which end hunger in this state.

An advisory board, composed of a representative from each food bank of the Florida Association of Food Banks, Inc., shall review the distribution of funds by the association.

Z. FLORIDA GOLF (Golf Capital of the World):

The Florida Golf license plate annual use fees shall be distributed to the Dade Amateur Golf Association, a nonprofit organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the International Revenue Code.

The annual use fees are to be allocated as follows:

1. Up to 15 percent may be used by the Dade Amateur Golf Association for the administration of the Florida Junior Golf Program.
2. The Dade Amateur Golf Association shall receive the first \$80,000 in proceeds towards operation of youth golf programs in Miami-Dade County. Thereafter, 15 percent of the proceeds shall be provided to the Dade Amateur Golf Association for the operation of youth golf programs in Miami-Dade County.
3. The remaining proceeds shall be available as grants to nonprofit organizations to operate youth golf programs and for marketing purposes.

AA. FLORIDA HORSE PARK (Discover Florida's Horses):

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park Authority created by [Section 570.952, Florida Statutes](#), which shall retain all proceeds until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered.

Thereafter, the proceeds shall be used as follows:

1. A maximum of five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees may be used for the administration of the Florida Horse Park license plate program.
2. A maximum of five percent of the proceeds may be used to promote and market the license plate.
3. The remaining proceeds shall be used by the authority to promote the Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park located in Marion County; to support continued development of the park, including the construction of additional educational facilities, barns and other structures; to provide improvements to the existing infrastructure at the park; and to provide operational expenses of the Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park.

BB. FLORIDA NASCAR:

The annual use fee shall be distributed to the Florida Sports Foundation, a direct-support organization of the Office of Tourism, Trade and Economic Development.

1. Up to five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees may be used by the Florida Sports Foundation for the administration of the NASCAR license plate program.

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2. The National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing shall receive up to \$60,000 in proceeds from the annual use fees toward startup costs, including those incurred in developing and issuing the plates. Thereafter, ten percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees shall be provided to the association for royalty rights, and the use of its marks.
3. The remaining proceeds from the annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Sports Foundation.

CC. FLORIDA PROFESSIONAL SPORTS TEAM:

The license plate annual use fees must be distributed as follows:

1. Fifty-five percent of the proceeds must be deposited into the Professional Sports Development Trust Fund. These funds must be used solely to attract and support major sport events in this state.
2. The remaining proceeds must be allocated to the Florida Sports Foundation to promote the economic development of the sports industry.

DD. FLORIDA SALUTES VETERANS (Salutes Veterans):

Twenty percent shall be distributed to a direct support organization for a period not exceeding 24 months after the date the direct support organization is incorporated.

Any remaining fees must be deposited in the Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans Affairs. The money is to be administered by the Department of Veteran Affairs and must be used solely for constructing, operating, maintaining domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans, as well as continuing to promote and market the license plate.

EE. FLORIDA SHERIFFS ASSOCIATION:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Sheriffs Association, a Section 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, which shall administer the fees as follows:

1. The Florida Sheriffs Association shall retain the first \$60,000 of the annual use fees for direct reimbursement of administrative and startup costs, and expenditures incurred in the development and approval process. Thereafter, up to ten percent of the annual use fee revenue may be used for administrative and marketing costs.
2. All remaining collected revenue must be used for continuing education for sheriffs office members.

FF. FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH RANCHES:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. for its operation.

GG. FLORIDA SUPPORTS EDUCATION (Support Education):

The annual use fees must be distributed as follows:

1. Up to ten percent of the money raised from the sale of the plates may be used for continuing marketing and promotion of the plates.
2. In each school district that has district pre-kindergarten through grade 12 public school foundations, or a direct-support organization, the money raised in that district through the sale of Florida Education license plates must be distributed to the foundation, or organization, for enhancing educational programs.
3. In each school district that does not have district pre-kindergarten through grade 12 public school foundations, or a direct-support organization, the money raised in that district through the sale of Florida Educational license plates must be distributed to the district school board and must be used at the discretion of the board for enhancing educational programs.

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HH. FLORIDA WILDFLOWER:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Wildflower Foundation, Inc., a not for profit corporation. The proceeds must be used to establish native Florida wildflower research programs, wildflower education and grant programs to municipal, county and community-based groups.

II. FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE:

This license plate may only be issued to a customer who submits a **current** copy of a notarized letter from the Florida State Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police stating that the customer is a member of the lodge in good standing, or a member of a lodge member's family. See [Exhibit B](#) for a sample letter.

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida State Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police, which will retain all revenue from the annual fees until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds shall be distributed to the Florida State Lodge Memorial Foundation of the Fraternal Order of Police and used as follows:

1. A maximum of ten percent of the proceeds may be used to promote and market the plate, to administer the license plate program and to pay administrative costs directly associated with the state Fraternal Order of Police Law Enforcement Memorial.
2. The remaining proceeds shall be used by the foundation to fund projects, programs, or events related to the memorial or to fund improvements, maintenance, or other support for the memorial.

JJ. FREEMASONRY:

The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed to the Masonic Home Endowment Fund, Inc., which may use a maximum of ten percent of the proceeds to promote and market the plate. The remainder of the proceeds shall be used by the Masonic Home Endowment Fund, Inc. to invest and reinvest, and use the interest for the operation of the Masonic Home of Florida, a five-star facility dedicated to the care of Masons and their families.

KK. HORSE COUNTRY:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to PCMI Properties, Inc. to fund programs involved in the rehabilitation of at-risk youth as directed by the Board of Trustees of PCMI Properties, Inc. Such funds may be used to provide educational materials, athletic equipment, transportation, food, medical services, counseling, scholarships and other direct administrative and program expenses. The funds may also be used as grants for expansion of youth rehabilitation programs in the state. Special consideration shall be given to programs using horses and other livestock in the efforts to redirect at-risk youth. PCMI Properties, Inc. may retain all revenue from the annual use fees until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, up to ten percent of the annual use fee revenue may be used for promotion and marketing of the plate and as necessary for annual audit or compliance affidavit costs.

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LL. HOSPICE (HOSPICE: EVERY DAY IS A GIFT):

The annual use fees shall be distributed to Florida Hospices and Palliative Care, Inc. to be used as follows:

1. To fund projects relating to hospice care for special groups, such as children, veterans, religious, gender, ethnic or minority groups; or to provide disease-specific research, or outreach.
2. To fund education and outreach for hospice volunteers, patients, families and health care professionals.
3. To fund informational and educational media programs regarding the availability of hospices.
4. To fund the expansion or enhancement of the Florida Hospices and Palliative Care, Inc. toll-free referral line, operated to provide hospice information.
5. To fund the expansion or enhancement of the Florida Hospices and Palliative Care, Inc. website.

The sum of \$90,000 in annual use fees shall be distributed to Florida Hospices and Palliative Care, Inc. to recover all startup costs. Thereafter, the proceeds shall be distributed to the Florida Hospices and Palliative Care, Inc., which shall distribute the fees through a standing committee that reviews funding solicitations and awards.

MM. INDIAN RIVER LAGOON:

The license plate annual use fees must be distributed as follows:

1. The first \$5 million collected annually must be transferred to the St. Johns River Water Management District. These funds must be distributed as follows:
 - a. An annual amount of the total license plate use fees must be earmarked for each of the six lagoon basin counties (Volusia, Brevard, Indian River, St. Lucie, Martin and Palm Beach) to be expended in those counties on habitat restoration, including water quality improvement and environmental education projects. At least 80 percent of the use fees must be used for restoration projects, and no more than 20 percent may be used for environmental education in each county.
 - b. Up to five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate. Any additional fees must be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

NN. IN GOD WE TRUST:

The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed to the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc. to fund educational scholarships for the children of Florida residents who are members of the United States Armed Forces, the National Guard and the United States Armed Forces Reserve, as well as for the children of public safety employees who have died in the line of duty who are not covered by existing state law. Funds shall also be distributed to other 501(c)(3) organizations that may apply for grants and scholarships, and to provide educational grants to public and private schools to promote the historical, and religious significance of American and Florida history. The In God We Trust Foundation, Inc. shall distribute the license plate annual use fees in the following manner:

1. The In God We Trust Foundation, Inc. shall retain all revenues from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered.

Ten percent of the funds received by the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc. shall be expended for administrative costs, promotion and marketing of the license plate directly associated with the operations of the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc.</p> <p>3. All remaining funds shall be expended by the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc. for programs.</p> <p>OO. INVEST IN CHILDREN:</p> <p>The proceeds of the Invest in Children license plate annual use fee must be deposited into the Juvenile Crime Prevention and Early Intervention Trust Fund within the Department of Juvenile Justice. The proceeds of the fee are to fund programs and services that are designed to prevent juvenile delinquency.</p> <p>PP. KEEP KIDS DRUG FREE:</p> <p>The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Keep Kids Drug-Free Foundation, Inc. for activities to reduce substance abuse among residents of this state.</p> <p>Up to ten percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee may be used for marketing the Keep Kids Drug-Free license plate, and for administrative costs directly related to the management and distribution of the proceeds.</p> <p>QQ. KIDS DESERVE JUSTICE:</p> <p>The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Bar Foundation, Inc. which shall use the funds to operate a grant award process to fund legal services programs for children, including legal services programs; programs to obtain federal benefits for disabled children; programs to obtain testing and services required by law for learning-disabled children; and programs to obtain permanent placement for abused and neglected children. The foundation may retain all proceeds until all costs for developing the license plate have been recovered.</p> <p>RR. LARGEMOUTH BASS (Go Fishing):</p> <p>The annual use fee shall be distributed to the State Game Trust Fund and used by the Game and Freshwater Fish Commission to fund current conservation programs that maintain current levels of protection and management of this state's fish and wildlife resources, including providing hunting, fishing and non-consumptive wildlife opportunities.</p> <p>SS. LAUREN'S KIDS:</p> <p>The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Lauren's Kids, Inc. a Florida nonprofit corporation, which may use up to ten percent of such fees for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The balance of the fees shall be used by Lauren's Kids, Inc. to prevent sexual abuse through awareness and education, and to help survivors heal with guidance and support.</p> <p>TT. LIVE THE DREAM:</p> <p>The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Dream Foundation, Inc. The Dream Foundation, Inc. shall retain the first \$60,000 as reimbursement for administrative and startup costs, and expenditures incurred in the approval process. Thereafter, up to 25 percent shall be used for continual promotion and marketing of the license plate and concept. The remaining funds shall be used as follows:</p>
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1. Twenty-five percent shall be distributed as grants for programs that provide research, care and treatment for sickle cell disease.
2. Twenty-five percent shall be distributed to the Florida chapter of the March of Dimes for programs and services that improve the health of babies through the prevention of birth defects and infant mortality.
3. Ten percent shall be distributed to the Florida Association of Healthy Start Coalitions to decrease racial disparity in infant mortality and to increase healthy birth outcomes. Funding will be used by local Healthy Start Coalitions to provide services and increase screening rates for high-risk pregnant women, children under four years of age and women of childbearing age.
4. Ten percent shall be distributed to the Community Partnership for Homeless, Inc. for programs that provide relief from poverty, hunger and homelessness.
5. Five percent shall be used by the foundation for administrative costs directly associated with operations as they relate to the management and distribution of proceeds.

UU. MANATEE (Save the Manatee):

The license plate annual use fee must be deposited into the Save the Manatee Trust Fund and may be used only for manatee-related environmental education, research, protection, recovery and specific facilities. Up to ten percent may be used to promote and market the license plate.

VV. MILITARY SERVICES (ARMY, NAVY, AIR FORCE, COAST GUARD):

The department shall retain all revenues from the sale of the above license plates until all start-up costs for developing and issuing the license plates have been recovered. Thereafter, the annual use fees shall be deposited into the Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans Affairs, and must be used solely to construct, operate and maintain domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans, subject to the requirements of [Chapter 216, Florida Statutes](#).

WW. MOTORCYCLE SPECIALTY:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to The Able Trust as a custodial agent. The Able Trust shall distribute the remaining funds as follows:

1. Twenty percent to the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program Trust Fund.
2. Twenty percent to Prevent Blindness Florida.
3. Twenty percent to the Blind Services Foundation of Florida.
4. Twenty percent to Florida Grants and Donations Trust Fund of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation.
5. Twenty percent to the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living.

XX. PANTHER (Protect the Panther):

The department must distribute the Florida Panther license plate annual use fees as follows:

1. Eighty-five percent must be deposited in the Florida Panther Research and Management Trust Fund in the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to be used for education and programs to protect the endangered Florida Panther; up to ten percent of such deposit may be used to promote and market the license plate.

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2. Fifteen percent, but no less than \$300,000 must be deposited in the Florida Communities Trust Fund to be used pursuant to the provisions of the Florida Communities Trust Act.

YY. PARENTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to The Gathering/USA, Inc. to fund personal counseling for parents, marriage seminars, "Dads and Moms That Make A Difference" seminars, father-and-son retreats, mother-and-daughter retreats and personal parenting behavioral assessments.

The Gathering/USA, Inc. shall retain all funds until all startup costs for developing and establishing the license plate have been recovered.

Thereafter, the funds shall be used as follows:

1. Up to five percent shall be expended for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of The Gathering/USA Inc., and up to 20 percent shall be expended for promotion and marketing of the license plate.
2. All remaining funds shall be expended by The Gathering/USA Inc. for programs.

ZZ. PLAY TENNIS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Sports Foundation. The United States Tennis Association Florida Section shall receive the first \$60,000 of the use fees to reimburse for startup and administrative costs, and other expenditures incurred in the development and approval process.

1. Up to five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees may be used by the Florida Sports Foundation to administer the license plate program.
2. Up to five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees may be used for promoting and marketing the license plates. The remaining proceeds shall be available as grants to the United States Tennis Association Florida Section Foundation, as well as to nonprofit organizations that operates youth and adaptive tennis programs for special populations of all ages. This includes buildings, renovations, and maintaining public tennis courts.

AAA. POLICE ATHLETIC LEAGUE:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the State of Florida Association of Police Athletic/Activities Leagues, Inc. to provide educational materials, athletic equipment, transportation, food, medical checkups, counseling and other direct expenses incurred by the league in conducting its youth program.

BBB. POLICE BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION (Support Law Enforcement):

The Police Benevolent Association license plate annual use fee shall be distributed to the Florida Police Benevolent Association Heart Fund, Inc., a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. The Florida Police Benevolent Association Heart Fund, Inc., shall distribute monies according to its articles of incorporation.

CCC. PROTECT FLORIDA SPRINGS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Wildlife Foundation of Florida, Inc., a citizen-support organization which shall administer the fees as follows:

1. Wildlife Foundation of Florida, Inc. shall retain the first \$60,000 of the annual use fees

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as direct reimbursement for administrative and startup costs, and expenditures incurred in the development and approval process.

2. Thereafter, a maximum of ten percent of the fees may be used for administrative costs directly associated with education programs, conservation, springs research and grant administration of the foundation. A maximum of 15 percent of the fees may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.
3. At least 55 percent of the fees shall be available for competitive grants which targets community-based springs research not currently available for state funding. The remaining 20 percent shall be directed toward community outreach programs aimed at implementing such research findings.
4. The remaining funds shall be distributed with the approval of and accountability to the board of directors of the Wildlife Foundation of Florida and shall be used to support activities contributing to education, outreach and springs conservation.

DDD. PROTECT FLORIDA WHALES:

The Protect Florida Whales license plate annual use fee shall be distributed to the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution, Inc.

The annual use fees are to be allocated as follows:

1. Up to 15 percent of the funds received by the institution may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution's Marine Mammal Research and Conservation program, and this specialty license plate funding.
2. Up to ten percent of the funds may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.
3. Ten percent of the fund shall be distributed to the Wyland Foundation, Inc. and used specifically to conduct educational programs in this state, which promotes conservation of Florida marine mammals.
4. The remainder of the funds shall be used by the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution, Inc. for protection of Florida Whales.

EEE. PROTECT OUR OCEANS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc. to fund marine-related scientific research, including that of free-ranging pelagic marine species that inhabit, use, or migrate through Florida waters; conservation initiatives; and education and public outreach programs targeting school-aged children in the state. The Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc. may retain all revenue up to \$60,000 from the annual use fees until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, up to ten percent may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc. and promotion and marketing of the license plate.

FFF. PROTECT OUR REEFS:

All proceeds of the annual use fee shall be distributed to Mote Marine Laboratory, Inc. to fund Florida reef research, conservation and education programs. Up to 15 percent of the funds may be expended for annual administrative costs directly associated with the administration of the Protect Our Reefs program. Up to ten percent of the funds may be used for continual promotion and marketing of the license plate. After reimbursement for documented costs expended in the establishment of the license plate, the funds shall be used and distributed to the following:

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eligible Florida-based scientific, conservation and education organizations for the collection, analysis and distribution of scientific, educational and conservation information to the research community; federal, state and local government agencies, as well as educational institutions and the public. Eligible organizations shall be based in Florida and engaged in reef research, conservation or education.

The State Auditor General's office may examine any records for funds received by Mote Marine Laboratory, Inc. and any other organization.

GGG. PROTECT WILD DOLPHINS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution, Inc. to fund research of the wild Florida Bottlenose Dolphin.

HHH. SAVE OUR SEAS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution, Inc. after reimbursement for documented costs expended for establishing the license plate. The Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution, Inc. shall use the remaining funds for marine science research and education programs as follows:

1. Ten percent shall be distributed to the Guy Harvey Research Institute of the Nova Southeastern University Oceanographic Center to conduct fisheries and shark research in the state.
2. Up to 15 percent may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institution's marine science and marine education programs, and administrative costs associated with the "Save Our Seas" license plate.
3. Up to ten percent may be used for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate.
4. The remaining funds shall be used to conduct scientific research and education on marine plants and animals, and coastal oceanography in state marine waters; to collect and analyze long-term data sets on the state's critical marine habitats; to determine changes in populations and communities or marine organisms and their impacts on the use of the state's marine resources; to maintain reference collections of scientific specimens and photographic archives of the state's marine plants and animals; and to conduct scientific conferences of relevance to the state's marine resources and their management, utilization and conservation.

III. SEA TURTLE:

The first \$500,000 of annual use fees shall be deposited in the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund in the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and shall be used by the Florida Marine Turtle Protection Program to conduct sea turtle protection, research and recovery programs. The next \$215,000 in annual use fees shall be distributed to the Caribbean Conservation Corporation to fund sea turtle research and education programs. The Caribbean Conservation Corporation shall annually distribute assigned funds through a Sea Turtle Grants Program that supports sea turtle research and education activities of Florida-based nonprofit groups, education and research institutions, and coastal counties in this state. The Caribbean Conservation Corporation shall write and publish procedures for submitting grant applications, and criteria for allocating available funds; shall appoint a technical advisory committee composed of at least five members to establish funding priorities and select grant recipients from proposals submitted by eligible entities.

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Any additional annual revenue shall be distributed as follows: 70 percent shall be deposited in the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund and used by the Florida Marine Turtle Protection Program for sea turtle conservation activities, while 30 percent shall be assigned to the Caribbean Conservation Corporation for distribution through the Sea Turtle Grants Program.

From the funds distributed to the Caribbean Conservation Corporation, an amount not to exceed ten percent of the total annual revenue from the sale of the plate may be used for marketing the Sea Turtle license plate, and for administrative costs directly associated with the grants program.

JJJ. SHARE THE ROAD:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to Bike Florida, Inc. up to 25 percent of which shall be used for marketing and promotion of the "Share the Road" concept and license plate.

KKK. SPECIAL OLYMPICS (Support Florida Special Olympics):

The license plate annual use fees must be distributed as follows:

1. The first \$5 million collected annually must be forwarded to the Florida Developmental Disabilities Planning Council and must be used solely for Special Olympics purposes.
2. Any additional fees must be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

LLL. STOP HEART DISEASE:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Heart Research Foundation, Inc. The first \$80,000 shall be used to pay startup costs. Thereafter, the Florida Heart Research Foundation, Inc. shall provide for a peer review grant solicitation and award process to distribute fees for cardiovascular disease research, education and prevention within the state, and shall make the funds available for any one or more of the following:

1. Quality research to pursue top quality cardiovascular research that will provide further understanding of heart disease and its cause, treatment, cure and prevention.
2. Heart disease prevention programs to provide cardiovascular screenings to state residents.
3. Education programs to offer literature, seminars or speakers for both clinicians and lay treatments, methodologies, protocols and preventive measures that are well known and used in the state.

In the first year in which the license plate is issued, no more than 25 percent of the annual use fees collected may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the Florida Heart Research Foundation, Inc. marketing and promotion of the license plate. In the second and subsequent years in which the license plate is sold, no more than 20 percent of the fees collected may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the Florida Heart Research Foundation, Inc. marketing and promotion of the license plate.

MMM. SUPPORT AUTISM PROGRAMS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc. to fund service programs for autism and related disabilities throughout the state and to operate and establish programs to support individuals with autism and related disabilities through direct services, evaluation, training and awareness. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc. shall establish an Autism Services Grant Council that shall provide grants from available Autism license plate proceeds to nonprofit organizations for direct services and programs for individuals with autism and related disabilities and their families.

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Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc. shall also establish an Autism License Plate Fund for use by the grant council. All funds received must be used in this state. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc. may retain all proceeds from the annual use fee up to \$85,000 until all documented startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds shall be used as follows:

1. Up to 15 percent of the proceeds may be used to administer the Autism License Plate Fund, the Autism Services Grant Council and related matters.
2. Funds may be used as necessary for annual audit or compliance affidavit costs.
3. Thirty-five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee shall be used to establish and operate programs to support individuals with autism and related disabilities and their families through direct services, evaluation, training and awareness in the state.
4. The Center for Autism and Related Disabilities at the University of Miami shall receive 15 percent of the proceeds for distribution to the seven regional autism centers. The regional centers shall use the proceeds to support the services they provide.
5. The remaining proceeds from the annual use fee shall be available to the Autism Services Grant Council for grants to nonprofit organizations that operate direct service programs for individuals with autism and their families, other related disabilities, as well as for marketing the Autism license plate. All grant recipients, including Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc. and the Center for Autism and Related Disabilities, shall be required to provide to the Autism Services Grant Council an annual program and financial report regarding the use of grant funds. Such reports shall be made available to the public.

NNN. SUPPORT HOMEOWNERSHIP FOR ALL:

The license plate annual use fees are to fund programs that provide, promote, or otherwise support affordable housing in this state.

1. May use a maximum of ten percent of the proceeds to promote and market the plate.
2. The remaining proceeds shall be used by Homeownership for All, Inc. to fund programs that provide, promote, or otherwise support affordable housing in this state.

OOO. SUPPORT OUR TROOPS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Support Our Troops, Inc. to be used for the benefit of Florida troops and their families in accordance with its articles of incorporation. Support Our Troops, Inc. shall receive the first \$60,000 of the use fees to offset startup costs for developing and establishing the plate. Thereafter, the department shall distribute the annual use fees as follows:

1. Twenty-five percent shall be distributed to Support Our Troops, Inc., to offset marketing, administration and promotion costs.
2. Of the remaining 75 percent, 65 percent shall be distributed to Support Our Troops, Inc. and 35 percent shall be distributed to the Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

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PPP. TAMPA BAY ESTUARY:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Tampa Bay Estuary Program. A maximum of five percent may be used for marketing the plate. The remaining proceeds must be used to implement the Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan for Tampa Bay.

QQQ. TREES ARE COOL:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture Inc. which shall retain the initial revenues from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered, not exceeding \$60,000. Thereafter the proceeds of the annual use fee shall be used in the following manner:

1. Twenty percent of the funds may be used by the Florida Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture, Inc. for continuing promotion and marketing of the license plate and concept. Five percent of the funds received by the Florida Society of Arboriculture, Inc. may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of the Florida Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture, Inc. with respect to the management of the Trees Are Cool license plate program.
2. Seventy five percent of the funds must be used to fulfill the mission of the Florida Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture, Inc.: to provide education and training statewide with respect to tree care and tree safety.

RRR. UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS (Marine Corps):

The first \$50,000 collected annually shall be distributed to the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, Inc. The remaining fees collected annually to be distributed as follows:

1. Thirty-five percent shall be deposited in the Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans Affairs and must be used to support program operations that benefit veterans or the operation, maintenance, or construction of domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans.
2. Sixty-five percent shall be distributed to the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, Inc. which shall use all fees distributed by the department to fund scholarships and assist Marine Corps Junior ROTC, and Young Marine programs of this state.

SSS. UNITED STATES OLYMPIC (U.S.A. Olympic Spirit):

The license plate annual use fees must be distributed as follows:

1. The first \$5 million collected annually must be paid to the Florida Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Amateur Sports to be distributed as follows:
 - a. Fifty percent must be distributed to the Sunshine State Games Foundation for Florida's Olympic Sports Festival for Amateur Athletes.
 - b. Fifty percent must be distributed to the United States Olympic Committee.
2. Any additional fees must be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

Annual use fee revenues shall be distributed to the Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans Affairs.

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TTT. UNITED WE STAND:

100 percent shall be distributed to the Department of Transportation SAFE Council to fund a grant program which enhances security at airports throughout Florida, pursuant to Section 332.14, Florida Statutes.

UUU. VISIT OUR LIGHTS:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida Lighthouse Association, Inc. which may use a maximum of ten percent of the proceeds to promote and market the plates. The remaining proceeds shall be used by the association to fund the preservation, restoration and protection of the 29 historic lighthouses remaining in the state.

VVV. WILDLIFE FOUNDATION OF FLORIDA:

The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Wildlife Foundation of Florida, Inc. a citizen support organization created pursuant to [Section 379.223, Florida Statutes](#). Such funds must be used as follows:

1. Seventy-five percent must be used to fund programs and projects within the state that preserve open space and wildlife habitat, promote conservation, improve wildlife habitat and establish open space for the perpetual use of the public.
2. Twenty-five percent may be used for promotion, marketing and administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the foundation.
